

**ADDITIONS AND AMENDMENTS
TO
THE ARTICLES AND SCHEDULES OF THE CONSTITUTION**

The additions and amendments to the Articles and Schedules listed below were agreed to by the Federal Council at its Virtual meeting of 24 & 27 June 2021. The Articles will become effective on **01 February 2022**, or as otherwise stated, and the Schedules on **01 October 2021** or as otherwise stated.

Clubs are reminded that in terms of Article 40 of the Constitution, Affiliated Clubs have the right to object to any proposed amendment or part thereof to the Articles, but this does not extend to the Schedules which are governed by Article 41 of the Constitution.

N.B.: The references refer to the Constitution and Schedules on the KUSA website (www.kusa.co.za).

AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES

ARTICLE 2 – INTERPRETATION OF TERMS

Add NEW:

“Protection of Personal Information Act, No. 4 of 2013” or “POPIA” means South Africa’ data privacy and data protection law enacted in 2013, which became effective on 1 July 2021, imposing acceptable standards of security on companies, organisations and other bodies in the capturing, management and storage of people’s personal information.

“Specialist Multi-breed Club” means a Club, the objects of which include the welfare of, interest in, or breeding of one or more recognised purebred dogs with a common ancestry and a partially-shared nomenclature, but nevertheless considered sufficiently diverse as to warrant separate Breed Standards in their countries of origin and under Schedule 2 Appendix “A”, which may include facilities for training of such dogs, in accordance with training tests approved for these breeds, hold Breed Shows in terms of this Constitution, provide information on breeding and rearing such dogs and generally promote the respective Breeds through Club activities in bringing breeders, members and other interested parties together to encourage interest and involvement in Club affairs to the betterment of these separate Breeds under the Club’s custodianship.

Amend to read:

“Specialist Club” means a Club, the objects of which include the welfare of, interest in, or breeding of a recognised specific single purebred dog, or varieties of such purebred dog, which varieties are accommodated in a single Breed Standard, which may include facilities for training of such dogs, in accordance with training tests approved for the breed, hold Breed Shows in terms of this Constitution, provide information on breeding and rearing such dogs and generally promote the Breed and any of its varieties through Club activities in bringing breeders, members and other interested parties together to encourage interest and involvement in Club affairs to the betterment of the Breed in all its varieties as described in its single Breed Standard.

ARTICLE 8 – AFFILIATION

8.6 Upon receipt of advice granting affiliation, the applicant shall, within twenty-one (21) days, forward the appropriate fees and annual public liability insurance premium as specified and shall observe and be subject to the following obligations:

The Club shall ensure that the Club Officers’ (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer) names and contact details are sent to KUSA for recording each time there is a change and shall further ensure that the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer, as well as any Committee Member with financial banking powers, i.e. with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Club’s bank accounts, are members in good standing of the Kennel Union. At the same time of sending the names and contact details of Club Officers to KUSA, the Club shall also advise the names of the Club Committee members with signing or

transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Club's bank accounts.

20. PROVINCIAL COUNCILS, LIAISON COUNCILS, BREED COUNCILS AND KUSA REPRESENTATIVES

All persons appointed, elected, delegated or co-opted to sit on any Provincial, Liaison, Breed Council, any committee or sub-committee thereof or to be a Kennel Union Representative at Licensed Shows shall be current members in good standing of the Kennel Union.

Minutes of Annual/Special General meetings shall be supplied within thirty (30) days of any such meeting and the copy of the audited accounts shall be supplied once in each calendar year. The Provincial Council shall ensure that the Council's Officers' (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer) names and contact details are sent to KUSA for recording each time there is a change and shall further ensure that the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer, as well as any Committee Member with financial banking powers, i.e. with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Provincial Council's bank accounts, are members in good standing of the Kennel Union. At the same time of sending the names and contact details of Provincial Council Officers to KUSA, the Provincial Council shall also advise the names of the members of the Provincial Council's Executive, i.e. Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Provincial Council's bank accounts.

20.2 Liaison Councils

20.2.2 Liaison Councils shall submit to the Federal Council details of every Annual General Meeting and any other Special General Meeting specifying the names of persons present and resolutions adopted, together with one copy of the annual audited accounts of income and expenditure and the Liaison Council's balance sheet. Minutes of Annual/Special General meetings shall be supplied within thirty (30) days of any such meeting and the copy of the audited accounts shall be supplied once in each calendar year. The Liaison Council shall ensure that the Council's Officers' (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer) names and contact details are sent to KUSA for recording each time there is a change and shall further ensure that the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer, as well as any Committee Member with financial banking powers, i.e. with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Liaison Council's bank accounts, are members in good standing of the Kennel Union. At the same time of sending the names and contact details of Liaison Council Officers to KUSA, the Liaison Council shall also advise the names of the members of the Liaison Council's Executive, i.e. Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Liaison Council's bank accounts.

20.3 Breed Councils

Minutes of Annual/Special General meetings shall be supplied within thirty (30) days of any such meeting and the copy of the audited accounts shall be supplied once in each calendar year. The Breed Council shall ensure that the Council's Officers' (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer) names and contact details are sent to KUSA for recording each time there is a change and shall further ensure that the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and POPIA-compliance Information Officer and Deputy Information Officer, as well as any Committee Member with financial banking powers, i.e. with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Breed Council's bank accounts, are members in good standing of the Kennel Union. At the same time of sending the names and contact details of Breed Council Officers to KUSA, the Breed Council shall also advise the names of the members of the Breed Council's Executive, i.e. Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, with signing or transacting powers, in whatever form, on any of the Breed Council's bank accounts.

2.4 a person making application to KUSA for the registration or transfer of a dog or the registration of an affix;

2.5 a person exhibiting or handling a dog at a show or other event held under a KUSA licence;

2.6 a person appointed to officiate or judge at a show or event held under a KUSA licence or sanctioned by KUSA, who has violated a condition of a judge’s or other agreement or who has acted in a improper, disgraceful, or discreditable manner during the execution of his or her judging assignment;

2.7 any person holding membership of any Club affiliated to KUSA; or

2.8 any member or person who has been elected or appointed to serve on any Club Committee, PC, or Sub-Committee established in terms of the KUSA Constitution or approved Club or PC Constitution.

SCHEDULE 2 - REGULATIONS FOR THE CLASSIFICATION, REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER OF THE REGISTERED OWNERSHIP OF DOGS (1989)

Amend to read:

16 BREEDERS’ RESTRICTIONS (ENDORSEMENTS)

The owner (breeder) of a puppy shall be entitled to request KUSA to place any or all of the following endorsements on its records of a dog upon initial registration, and mark the relevant application form for the registration of a litter accordingly, using the applicable symbols.

N/B Not authorised for Breeding.

N/S Not Eligible for exhibition at a KUSA Breed Dog Show.

N/E Not eligible for the issue of an Export Pedigree.

Any endorsement imposed by the breeder in terms of this Regulation may only be lifted at the written request of the person imposing it, or their heirs or executors.

APPENDIX “E” – Breed Specific Requirements for Imported & Exported Dogs & Imported Semen

8.1. An imported Retriever (Labrador) may only be placed on the KUSA Breed Register upon presentation of a clear test result for the dilute colour gene for the dog in question, from a recognised genetic laboratory in the country of origin or South Africa, or by being proven hereditarily clear, of either carrying the Dilute gene (“Dd”), or of being affected 2 by the Dilute gene (“dd”). For the avoidance of doubt, the test result must reflect a result for the D Locus of “DD” for the dog, or for both its parents, to be eligible for Breed Registration.

8.2. No offspring from imported Retriever (Labrador) semen, collected on or after 1 October 2021, may be placed on the KUSA Breed Register, unless a clear test result for the dilute colour gene for the dog in question can be produced, either from a recognised genetic laboratory in the country of origin or South Africa; or, the semen donor can be proven to be hereditarily clear of either carrying the Dilute gene (“Dd”), or of being affected by the Dilute gene (“dd”). For the avoidance of doubt, the importer must furnish the KUSA with proof of a Dilute gene result of “DD” for the semen donor, or for both his parents, in order for the litters sired by the donor to be eligible for Breed Registration.

Regulation 24 – COMPETITION FOR GROUP WINNERS AND BEST IN SHOW AND BEST PUPPY IN SHOW

Add NEW:

24.2.5 At every Specialist Multi-breed Championship Show where two or more breeds confined to a single Group is scheduled, once the Judge has made his choice for Best in Show, the remaining exhibit(s) shall await the recall of the runner-up to the Best in Show in the Breed Challenge, i.e. the Reserve Best of Breed exhibit, to challenge for Reserve Best in Show. All other best Class of Breed awards shall be made on an inter-breed basis.

24.3.1 At every Specialist Championship Show where two or more varieties of a Breed are scheduled, the Club shall be entitled to elect whether, for Reserve Best in Show, there would be a call-back of the runner-up to the dog awarded Best in Show (i.e. the Reserve Best of Breed in that variety), or whether Reserve Best in Show would be awarded the Best of Breed winner of the other variety/one of the other varieties. The procedure for awarding Best in Show should be clearly stipulated in the Show Schedule.

Amend to read:

24.2.1 At every Championship Show where dogs of more than one breed, but confined to one Group only, are scheduled, Specialist Multi-breed Shows included, dogs awarded Best of Breed and Best Puppy of Breed shall be eligible for free entry into their respective Best in Show Challenges.

24.2.4 At every Championship Show where dogs of more than one breed, but confined to one Group only, are scheduled, Specialist Multi-Breed Shows excluded, the first four (4) exhibits in the Best in Show and Best Puppy in Show shall be placed 1 to 4 in order of merit (and may be announced in reverse order).

24.2.6 The various Best in Show Challenges, whether at a Group, multiple Group or All-Breeds Championship Show, shall be judged by the same Judge.

24.2.7 Details of the order of judging of the various Best in Show Challenges on offer shall be published in the show schedule and in the catalogue.

24.3 At every Championship Show where dogs of one breed only are scheduled, the exhibits eligible to compete free of entry fees for Best in Show are Challenge Certificate winners and unbeaten prize winners in any restricted class as defined in Appendix 1 of this Schedule, and the exhibits eligible to compete free of entry fees for Best Puppy in Show are all the Minor Puppy and Puppy class winners.

2. An FCI Show is a Show at which the relevant FCI Regulations generally apply. Dogs are judged according to FCI Breed Standards for all FCI-recognised Breeds where any FCI-C.A.C.I.B.® (Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International) and/or FCI-C.A.C.I.A.G.® (Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International d'Agility) and/or FCI-C.A.C.I.T.® (Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International de Travail de la FCI) award is on offer. Such Show may be held by the Kennel Union or by an All-breeds Club granted a licence by the Executive Committee to hold such Show in addition to their Annual Championship Show(s).

Add NEW:

3.1 Clubs holding FCI-C.A.C.I.B.® International Shows must specify on their Show Schedules whether, or not, Reports (Critiques) would be on offer at the Show and, if so, under which conditions and to which exhibits. (In this regard, refer to the BREED ASSIGNMENT section of the Regulations for FCI Dog Shows).

DEFINITION OF RALLY DOG

Amend to read:

Rally Dog (hereinafter referred to as 'Rally') is a dogsport based on Obedience. Instead of requiring the Judge to provide a heel pattern (for example), Rally competitors proceed around a course with designated stations, the dog in heel position. At each station an exercise is performed and the dog and handler are marked on their ability to execute the commands at the stations correctly, as well as the connection between dog and handler between and at the stations.

SCHEDULE 11 – CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN BRANCHES OF DOGSPORT AS COMPANION EVENTS

(Effective.....)

1. At the discretion of the Federal Council, certain branches of Dogsport shall be classified as "Companion Events" in accordance with a decision reached at the meeting of the Federal Council on 4 & 5 December 2020.

2. Such Companion Events shall be regulated under subsections of this Schedule.

3. The Federal Council shall be entitled to add to, or reduce, the Companion Events hereby classified and amend the Regulations applicable to any or all of them in accordance with Article 40.1.

4. The following branches of Dogsport shall be classified as Companion Events:

Canine Good Citizen (Schedule 11A)

Scent Work (Schedule 11B)
Trick Dog Test (Schedule 11C)
