Last year, we represented our club and our beloved Boxers at World of Dogs and Cats Pet Expo (WODAC) at the KUSA stand with an hour each day allocated to working dogs. Some of our Boxers were entered in the WODAC shows and although we did not win, we got special mention for having Boxers in the ring at WODAC for the first time in a very long time.

Furthermore, in December last year, we shared a stand with BCGR at the Fair Play exhibition. We spent two wonderful days speaking with many members of the public about our clubs, the Breed Council and most importantly about the Boxer as a wonderful family dog. I am happy to report that our Boxers we had with us as our ambassadors received a lot of favourable attention, especially from the children. Fair Play also hosted the best of the best dog of the year show and we are very proud that several of our Boxers qualified for this prestigious event and although they were not crowned Top Dog, just by being there, we celebrate them on that achievement alone.

This year, WODAC will be held from 19 to 21 July 2019 inclusive at the Gallagher Convention Centre in Midrand. 

DOG FLU: KEEP YOUR PET SAFE

You've heard of flu outbreaks making people sick, but they can happen to dogs, too. Our doggie friends can catch "canine influenza," which not only makes them feel bad, but can be dangerous to them.

If you know the signs, you can help your dog feel better, or maybe keep him from getting sick at all.

Symptoms

"Just like when people get the flu, you can expect your dog to sneeze, have a runny nose, and cough," says Barry N. Kellogg, senior veterinary advisor to the Humane Society Veterinary Medical Association. Your dog may also be tired and not have his usual appetite. Some dogs also can have a fever of 104-106 F.



Treatment

Just like people, dogs need rest and fluids, Kellogg says. Make sure your pet has a quiet, comfortable place to recover and plenty of water to drink. Your vet may prescribe antibiotics if your dog gets a bacterial infection along with the flu.

If your pet shows any signs that he's sick, it's important to keep him away from other dogs. Avoid dog parks, kennels, or any other place where he'll be around a lot of other dogs, Adalja says. Most dogs get better in 2-3 weeks.


