7.1 **Disciplinary Sub-Committee**

7.1.1 Case 2024-01 – KUSA (Van Vliet) vs Brunner – Appeal

No further updates received. A reminder was sent to the NIGPSC on 15.01.2025. CPA reported that a response had been received from Mr JQ Swartz that the relevant training is being provided. The validity of the awards was, however, still in question. After discussion, it was decided that the awards were to remain in place.

A further response has since been received from the National IGP Sub-Committee. See attached.

CPA to send a letter on behalf of the Exco Chairman to the National Convener, Mr JQ Swartz, alerting him to the fact that neither he, nor anybody else, had the authority to override Regulations for a trial to continue when one dog had been withdrawn due to injury.

It was noted that a letter had been sent to Mr Swartz on 28.02.2025, but that neither acknowledgement, nor response, had been received. Exco directed that the Fedco Portfolio-holder for IGP, Ms Nikki Redtenbacher, should be approached to engage with Mr Swartz on the matter in final attempt to broker some form of resolution. [Also refer to Item 10.3..3]

7.1.2 Case 2024-03 – KUSA vs Ingram

A DSC has been appointed, and the hearing has been scheduled for 23 January 2025.

The DCA convened on 23.01.2025. The record of proceedings has not yet been finalised and, in consequence, has not yet been sent to the Acting KUSA Secretary as required under Schedule 01 Rule 10.14. The DSC has notified the Acting KUSA Secretary that it needed to extend the date for the submission of the record of proceedings until 10.03.2025, which extension it is entitled to claim under Rule 1.16.

Schedule 01 Rule 10.14:

The Chairman must, within fourteen (14) days of the conclusion of the hearing, forward the record of the proceedings to the Secretary or his or her duly appointed deputy, who must within thirty (30) days of the conclusion of the hearing and after Exco has **confirmed the record of proceedings in terms of Rule 10.16**, inform both the Complainant and Respondent as provided in Rules 1.14 and 1.15. [**Emphasis** added]

Exco to confirm the Record of Proceedings.

The Record of Proceedings was confirmed, unanimously, and the finding of the DSC authorised for distribution.

Finding:

- 1. After careful consideration of all the submitted evidence, documents and affidavits, the DSC unanimously reached the following decision, on a balance of probabilities, with regard to Case 2024-03 before them:
 - a. The DSC found that the first complaint was fully substantiated by the presented evidence and that, by submitting an Application for Registration of a Complete Litter on behalf of the late Mr DW Thompson to the Kennel Union on 5 April 2022, which declared the puppies to have resulted from a natural mating, whilst in the full knowledge that the declaration was false and fraudulent, the Respondent's actions amounted to complicity in a premeditated, deliberate and malicious attempt to compromise the integrity of KUSA's Primary Breed Registry. The DSC found not only inconceivable, but also highly improbable, the explanation offered by the Respondent that he had not thoroughly applied his mind to the registration application when he submitted it to KUSA, when the facts clearly show that he was actively and intimately involved during the entire **Dual Sire** mating process from the outset right up to the submission of the registration documentation, and even beyond. Moreover, the DSC noted that the Respondent went so far as to commission DNA tests on the resulting litter and, according to his own statement, tried to phone KUSA (allegedly without success) to establish the correct procedure for registering a litter resulting from a **Dual Sire** mating. There can, therefore, be no other conclusion that the Respondent had acted intentionally as he was obviously aware of the procedure laid down in Schedule 02 Regulation 4.5 and, in consequence, cognisant of the fact that breaching KUSA's regulatory framework posed a substantial risk of harm with potentially dire consequences.
 - b. The DSC found that the second complaint was fully substantiated by the presented evidence, and that the letter of apology sent by the Respondent to the KUSA Secretary, was a clear admission by the Respondent that he had breached Schedule 09 (Code of Ethics for Members of the Kennel Union of Southern Africa) Regulations 2.1, 2.5 and 2.6 in his dealings with a KUSA staff member.
 - c. The DSC therefore **found the Respondent guilty** of contravening Schedule 01 Rules 4.1.1 and the previously cited sub-Rules and, further, of contravening Schedule 02, Regulation 4.5 and Schedule 09 (Code of Ethics for Members of the Kennel Union of Southern Africa) Regulations 2.1, 2.5 and 2.6, as well as Schedule 09 Appendix "B" (Code of Conduct for Judges Licensed by KUSA) Regulation 1.2.

In setting the Penalties for the above findings, the DSC not only lamented the fact that the Respondent had been complicit in breaching KUSA's regulatory framework, but that he had done so as a longstanding KUSA member, who had enjoyed the support and confidence of KUSA and the dog-showing fraternity at large. This resulted in his being entrusted with the chairmanship of a KUSA-affiliated Club and a licence to judge the Terrier Group at KUSA-licensed events and to be afforded clearance to officiate in the same capacity for certain Terrier breeds in foreign countries. For many years, he enjoyed a position of authority and esteem in

the dog community, a person to whom prospective puppy buyers, competitors and learner judges looked to for guidance, knowledge, mentorship and leadership.

Taking into consideration the nature and seriousness of the misconduct, the personal circumstances of the Respondent and the fact that he was a first offender and other applicable mitigating and aggravating factors and circumstances, as well as the interest of KUSA and the effect that the Respondent's misconduct has had on the integrity of its Primary Breed Register, and coupled with the expectation of the KUSA membership that the organisation shall sufficiently and appropriately deal with such misconduct so as to deter others from committing the same or similar transgressions in future, amongst other reasons, the DSC imposed the following penalties:

Penalties:

Issue 1 – Matters relating to the Application for Registration of a Complete Litter resulting from an undeclared Dual Sire mating

- 1.1 In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.1, the Respondent is expelled from membership of KUSA for a period of ten (10) years, which penalty is suspended in full, provided that the Respondent is not found in breach of any Regulation as described in Schedule 02 or Schedule 03 during the period of suspension.
- 1.2 In terms of Rule 11.1.2 of Schedule 01, the Respondent is excluded from acting as an Officer (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer) of a Club for a period of five (5) years.
- 1.3 In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.5, the Respondent is disqualified from officiating as a Judge at any Show or event held under KUSA licence, or from officiating as a Judge at any Shows licensed by a National Canine Organisation (NCO) holding any category of membership or contract partnership of the FCI, or from officiating as a Judge in any non-FCI country at a Show or event held under the jurisdiction of an NCO with which KUSA has arrangements of mutual recognition and reciprocity, for a period of five (5) years.
- 1.4 In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.6, a fine in the amount of two thousand five hundred rands (R2,500.00) in part compensation of the costs KUSA had incurred in the course of its investigation and in rectification of the contamination of its Primary Breed Register, caused by the misconduct of the Respondent.
- Issue 2 Matters relating to inappropriate behaviour towards a KUSA staff member
 - 2. In terms of Rule 11.1.7 of Schedule 09, the Respondent is to be issued with a letter of reprimand and warning for the contravention of Schedule 09.

General

The DSC ruled that the penalties as described above would run concurrently and that the above penalties described in 1.1, 1.2 and 1.3 will take effect on 31 March 2025.

The Respondent must be notified of his right of appeal as per Schedule 01 Rule 12.

The Respondent has lodged an appeal against the Finding and the Penalties imposed by the DSC and his Notice of Appeal was received in time. The Appeal documentation was currently under consideration by the Sub-Committee of Inquiry (SCI).

7.1.3 Case 2024-04 – KUSA vs Botes

A DSC has been appointed, and the hearing has been scheduled for 13 February 2025.

The DCA convened on 13.02.2025. The record of proceedings has not yet been finalised.

Schedule 01 Rule 10.14:

The Chairman must, within fourteen (14) days of the conclusion of the hearing, forward the record of the proceedings to the Secretary or his or her duly appointed deputy, who must within thirty (30) days of the conclusion of the hearing and after Exco has **confirmed the record of proceedings in terms of Rule 10.16**, inform both the Complainant and Respondent as provided in Rules 1.14 and 1.15. [**Emphasis** added]

Exco to confirm the Record of Proceedings.

The Record of Proceedings was confirmed, unanimously, and the finding of the DSC authorised for distribution.

Finding:

After careful consideration of all the submitted evidence, documents and affidavits submitted in relation to Case 2024-04, the DSC unanimously found, on a balance of probabilities, **that the complaint was fully substantiated**.

Penalties:

- In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.1, the Respondent is expelled from membership of KUSA for a **period of ten (10) years**, which penalty is **suspended in full**, provided that the Respondent is not found in breach of any Regulation as described in Schedule 02 during the period of suspension.
- In terms of Rule 11.1.2 of Schedule 01, the Respondent is excluded from acting as an Officer of a Club (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer) for a period of five (5) years.
- In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.3, the Respondent is disqualified from registration, recording, exhibition or evaluation of a dog owned by him or registered or recorded in his name, or jointly with another or others, or in the name of a nominee, or of the progeny of such a dog, **for a period of five (5) years**. The Respondent may, however, transfer dogs during this period.
- In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.5, the Respondent is disqualified from taking part in the management of any Show or event held under KUSA licence or licensed by a National Canine Organisation (NCO) holding any category of membership or contract partnership with the FCI, or officiating in any non-FCI country at a Show or event held under the jurisdiction of an NCO with which KUSA has arrangements of mutual recognition and reciprocity **for a period of five (5) years.** This includes acting as a Helper.
- In terms of Schedule 01 Rule 11.1.6, a fine in the amount of two thousand rands (R2,000.00) per puppy is imposed in part compensation for the costs KUSA has incurred to date in relation to this case. This excludes the KUSA fee relating to possible amendments to the Certificates of Registration issued for the six (6) puppies.

The Respondent is to be notified of his right of appeal as per Schedule 01 Rule 12.

It was reported that an incident involving the abovementioned dog took place at the Working & Herding Breeds of the Cape Championship Show (on loan to the Western Cape Working Trials Sub-Committee) held on 02.09.2023. The incident was discussed by the Judge and Show Secretary, and it was agreed to give the dog the benefit of the doubt and not declare it an Incident of Aggression (see attached).

Incident 2

It was reported that the abovementioned dog acted aggressively at the Cape Handlers Dog Club Non-Championship Show held on 02.08.2023 where it showed aggression towards the Learner Judge (see attached).

TEO confirmed 20.09.2023

The Registered Owner of the dog contacted the KUSA Office on 16.01.2025, asking how to proceed to have the TEO lifted. However, the Decision Letter provided to the Registered Owner on confirmation of the TEO, and the TEO Manual state (emphasis added for clarity):

14.5. The Owner of any Implicated Dog, which has been issued with a confirmed TEO, has a maximum period of 12 (twelve) months from the date of the TEO (the date the TEO was confirmed by the Executive Committee) to successfully complete the requirements as provided for in Step 1, 2 and 3 of this Manual, failing which, the Executive Committee will apply to the Federal Council to have the Implicated Dog permanently barred from entry to and exhibition at any future KUSA-licensed Shows/Events subject to compliance with the procedure as provided for in Clause 11.11 hereof.

CPA to prepare a proposal and compile a list of dogs that have exceeded the 12-month period to be tabled to Fedco at the next FDF. Fedco's opinion to be solicited on whether Exco was able to grant an extension on the 12-month rule.

Document prepared for Fedco – awaiting feedback. [Also refer Item 9.2]

PM reported that the matter had been discussed at the Fedco FDF Session 4 held on 25.03.2025 and Fedco were of the opinion that there is a TEO procedure in place which would need to be followed and adhered to and that requirements need to be met, one of which was that Exco had to apply to Fedco to have implicated dogs permanently barred from entry and exhibition after the 12-month period.

CPA to inform the owner that, should she wish to continue with this procedure, that she would need to submit an official written appeal to the Federal Council for consideration.

9.1.2 **Temporary Exclusion Order** – Retriever (Flat-coated) – Sheadoes Sweet Talker – Reg No. ZA011488B20

It was reported that the abovementioned dog had acted and behaved aggressively by attacking another Exhibit at the TKC Kennel Club Championship Show held on 13.10.2024. Both the Club and the Registered Owner have submitted documents relating to this incident. A preliminary TEO was issued on 18.10.2024.

The dog is to complete a socialisation course (TEO Manual 12.2.1.3), provide KUSA with a letter of proof from the Training Club (TEO Manual 12.2.1.3.2 and 12.2.1.3.3) and then complete a CGC Silver (TEO Manual 12.2.1.4).

The Owner has submitted the following documents in support of the TEO being lifted:

- Unsigned letter from Club saying the dog had attended a training day and not shown any aggression
- Unsigned letter from an observer at the training day and on the day the dog completed its CGC
- Proof of CGC Silver

After discussion it was decided that the dog must complete a 3-month dog training course and it was noted that the dog has been enrolled with the Dog Training Club of Bredell. Once a suitable socialisation course has been completed, a letter of clearance needed to be obtained from the relevant Club before the lifting of the TEO would be considered by Exco. The owner of the dog has provided evidence of the dog having been enrolled in two training Clubs. Signed copies of the two letters provided had since been submitted to the KUSA Office. **Noted.**

Following the decision taken at Exco 01.2025 (that the dog complete a 3-month dog training course), the Registered Owner is applying to have the TEO lifted and has submitted the following document in support of this application:

Letter from the Dog Training Club of Bredell dated 19.02.2025

Subsequent to the TEO being issued, the dog successfully completed a CGC Silver on 30.11.2024.

CPA to inform owner that she may apply to have the TEO lifted at the end of the 3-month period which would be 31.03.2025. BJ granted permission for the matter to be decided via round robin should the owner be unwilling to wait until the April Exco meeting for a decision.

4.2.1 The minimum number of participants is four handlers.

Schedule 05B(02) Appendix B Trial Participants

The trial participant must meet the entry deadline for the event. The participant also agrees to pay the entry fee upon submission of the entry form. If the participant cannot participate for whatever reason, he/she must advise the Trial Secretary (PL) immediately. The participant is required to provide the vaccination certificate and uphold the animal rights guidelines. The participant must adhere to the instructions of the judge (LR) as well as the Trial Secretary. The handler must present his/her dog in a sportsmanlike manner regardless of the results in any given phase, he is obliged to continue for the remaining phases of the event. The trial ends with the results (awards ceremony) and the return of the scorebook.

The examination (trial) must have a minimum of 4 participants per trial day. The minimum number of participants per day may only be less if for FCI-BH/VT or BH/VT (NPO) examinations these dogs pass and try for a further examination (FCI-IGP-1, FCI-IFH 1) at the same event. A dog handler may only take part in an examination with the same dog. (A two-day test is considered as an examination event.) A dog handler may enter a maximum of two dogs for an examination at an event. A dog may only acquire one title within a event. Exception: FCI-BH/VT or BH/VT (NPO) in conjunction with another level 1 (FCI-IGP) title. Prerequisite for entering a trial is that owner and dog handler belong to a club of the national organization which is recognized by the FCI. Exceptions to this can be determined by the national canine organization (FCI-NCO) only for FCI-BH/VT or BH/VT (NPO) examinations.

Referring to the Minutes of the 02.2025 Exco meeting, a similar format of the BH event was held, with only two competitors. The Officiating Judge was the National Convenor, Mr JQ Swartz.

As the IGP was held the day before the BH event, the exclusion above does not apply. The Office would like guidance on the clearing of such events, and the validity of awards gained.
