**GUIDELINES ON REGISTRATION OF IMPORT/EXPORT AGENTS
AND IMPORTATION AND EXPORTATION OF DOGS**

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INTRODUCTION

South Africa has a number of indigenous or locally adapted and imported breeds that have adapted to prevailing environmental conditions for the South African climate and economic needs. Effective breeding programmes have been at the foundation of sustainable animal agriculture industries in South Africa. Legislation together with sound science and technology has helped to ensure that the genetic merit of South African animals has been improving over generations.

Import and export of animals is one of the regulatory functions performed under sub directorate: Animal Production Regulatory Support guided by the Animal Improvement Act, 1998 (Act 62 of 1998) or AIA. AIA serves as a legislative framework to guide on production of both registered and unregistered animals and to protect the animal production sector from uncontrolled breeding and reckless mating of animals to avoid erosion of pure genetics and development of unknown breeds in the country.

Dogs including different dog breeds have been declared as kinds of animals in terms of the Act. In addition to other laws governing dogs, the AIA remains the legal instrument to protect the South African animal agriculture industries and to control breeding of animals in the country.

PART 1: DEFINITIONS

“Animal” means a kind of animal or an animal of a specified breed within a species of such kind of animal, which has in terms of section 2 been declared as an animal for the purposes of this act

“Export” means to take out or send an animal from the Republic to a country or territory outside the Republic or to cause an animal or genetic material to be so taken or sent out

“Import and Export Agent” means a person who brings and/or take out an animal on behalf of another person and who is registered as such in terms of section 8 (6) (a);

“Import” means to bring an animal from outside the Republic into the Republic or to cause an animal or genetic material to be so brought into the Republic

“Registering authority” means an animal breeders’ society or a group of animal breeders’ societies, which is registered as such in terms of section 8 (7) a (ii).

“Regulation” means a regulation made under this Act

PART 2: GUIDELINES ON REGISTRATION OF DOG IMPORT AND EXPORT AGENTS

Registration of import and export agents

- (1) All agents involved in the import and export of dogs are required to register in accordance with section 8(6)(a) and section 28 of the Animal Improvement Act, 1998 (Act 62 of 1998) as dog import agents to facilitate cross-border movement of dogs, to control breeding of dogs in the country, and to ensure compliance with the Act.
- (2) An application for registration as a dog import and export agent shall be submitted to the Registrar of Animal Improvement on a form that is obtainable from his/her office for this purpose.
- (3) An application referred to in subregulation (2) shall be accompanied by:
 - (a) the application fee specified in the annual tariffs as per Treasury regulations
 - (b) certification by a competent official for these purposes:
 - (i) the applicant has proved to have all the prescribed equipment/facility (this can be done through inspection by a competent official).
 - (ii) that the applicant or a person in the employ of the applicant is competent with the handling and humane transportation of dogs.

PART 3: GUIDELINES ON APPLICATION FOR IMPORTATION AND EXPORTATION OF DOGS

- (1) All AIA applications for import and export permits must be submitted at least 30 days prior to intended importation as stipulated on the application form.
- (2) All AIA permit applications are treated as normal applications that will be processed within 30 days upon receipt. Only applications for dogs coming for veterinary treatments will be treated as urgent, provided there is proof attached.
 - (a) No walk-ins or emailed AIA permit applicants will be processed immediately,
 - (i) It is important to submit applications in a timely manner (30 days prior to arrival or departure) since the import permit application can only be processed within 30 days upon receipt.
 - (ii) No walk-ins will be allowed for AIA permits that needs to be amended/reissued.
 - (iii) Permits to be amended/re-issued will be treated as new applications.

(3) It is the agent's responsibility to submit all necessary supporting attachments (proof of payment, sterilization certificate from the **State Veterinarian**, third party authorization letter, applicant's ID/passport, and proof of address from the exporting country) and a **fully completed** AIA dog import/export application.

(a) Failure to provide all required documentation or incomplete applications may result in rejection of the import or export permit application, and a new corrected application should be sent at a cost.

(b) Incomplete applications will be considered as new applications when corrected, and the 30 days rule prior to arrival or departure may/will be applied to the resubmitted application.

(c) Reissuing AIA dog import or export permit after a mistake was made by the client or agent on the initial application form will necessitate the submission of a new application along with new proof of payment. Therefore, the 30 days prior to arrival or departure rule may/will be applied to the resubmitted application.

(d) The application fee for application of Animal Improvement permit is **NON-REFUNDABLE**.

(4) All dogs imported to South Africa are mandated to be sterilized if they are going to be used for other purposes other than breeding or they must be pre-approved by AIA registered registering authorities if they are imported to be used as breeding dogs.

Declared companion dogs (not meant for breeding) imported to South Africa permanently must be sterilized and are prohibited to be imported if they are less than 8 months old.

(a) Dogs imported to South Africa temporarily for certain purposes (e.g. vacation) should be sterilized temporarily using chemical castration and proof (preferably from a State Veterinarian) of such must be provided.

(b) Dogs imported to South Africa as breeding dogs must be registered with the registering authorities recognized by the AIA in South Africa and may be imported from 8 weeks of age or older.

(i) These include dogs imported for shows, competition, and hunting dogs.

(ii) Puppies older than 8 months are required to be sterilized or approved by AIA registered registering authority before being imported into South Africa.

(c) If veterinary service or sterilization is not available in the exporting country, it is the agent's responsibility to assist the applicant with booking for a veterinary service in South Africa, and proof must be provided to the Registrar upon application for importation.

(i) Once the dog has been sterilized in South Africa, it is the agent's responsibility to provide proof of sterilization certificate to the Animal Improvement office. Failure to do so will result in disapproval for future applications.

- (d) Application for importation of ex-South African dogs should be accompanied by Animal Improvement export permit. Export Health Certificate will be required for such dogs if they were exported before 01 April 2024.
- (e) All dogs imported through South Africa *in transit* to the country's neighbouring countries must be accompanied by AIA import permit.
 - (i) All application for in transit to neighbouring countries of South Africa must be accompanied by the clients in transit route letter to their destination.
- (f) All dogs imported to South Africa for pre-quarantine and later *en route* to another country must be accompanied by AIA import permit.
 - (g) All application for pre-quarantine and later *en-route* to another country must be accompanied by client's travel arrangements to the destination.
- (5) A list of dog breeds declared under Section 2 the AIA upon request is available to all agents, to ensure that only authorized dog breeds are imported into South Africa.
 - (a) All AIA import applications for undeclared dog breeds for breeding purposes will be rejected. For such dogs, a biological impact study must be undertaken through approval by the Registrar of Animal Improvement.
 - (b) Applications for undeclared companion dog breeds will only be approved if the dog is sterilized.
- (6) Original AIA import and export permits must be collected at the Animal Improvement office (Agriculture Place, 20 Steve Biko Street, Arcadia, Pretoria, 0008, Block R) as they are requested for verification at the airports and border posts.
- (7) Once the AIA import and export permit is issued, a copy of the permit will be sent and must be used to accompany the veterinary permit application.
 - (a) Collections of AIA import and export original permits must only be done when a collection confirmation email has been sent with a copy of the permit attached.
 - (i) The import and export agent's company name and client's name must appear on the courier collection letter, or a copy of the permit can be attached with the note as well for collection of AIA import and export permit by courier companies.
- (8) It is important for dog import and export agents to familiarize themselves with the regulations and guidelines of the AIA to avoid any delays or complications in the import/export process.

APPLICATIONS FOR IMPORTATION OF DOGS

Applications for importation of dogs as companion pets

- (a) Applications for AIA import permit of companion dogs must be accompanied
- (b) by a sterilization certificate or proof of AIA export permit.

Application for importation of service/training dogs

- (a) Application for AIA import permit of service/training dogs must be accompanied by a service request letter or proof of service certificate for the dog.

Application for importation of diplomats/ambassadors' dogs

- (a) Application for AIA import permit of diplomats/ambassadors' dogs must be accompanied by an official employment letter or diplomatic/ambassador documents.

Application for importation of breeding dogs

- (a) Application for AIA import permit of breeding dogs must first be pre-approved by the recognized South African registering authority before the application could be sent to AIA office.

APPLICATIONS FOR EXPORTATION OF DOGS TO OTHER COUNTRIES

Applications for exportation of dogs as companion pets

- (a) Exportation of all declared companion dogs to other countries must be accompanied by AIA export permit.
 - (i) If the exportation is for companion purposes, the applicant must obtain an export permit from office of Registrar of Animal Improvement before applying for an export health certificate.
 - (ii) If a companion dog is exported to other countries without AIA export permit and the client intends to bring the dog back, it will not be allowed to be imported into the country. without the AIA export permit.

Applications for exportation of breeding dogs

- (i) If the exportation is for breeding purposes, the applicant must obtain authorisation from a registered registering authority of breeders' society for that breed before applying for AIA export permit.
- (ii) If a breeding dog is exported to other countries without AIA export permit and the client intends to bring the dog back. Such dog will not be allowed to be re-imported into the country. without the AIA proof of export permit.

NB: Registrar of Animal Improvement, at his/her discretion and provided he/she has good and valid reason, may impose any further requirements, or request any additional information deemed necessary to evaluate and approve, or deny, the import/export agent certification/permit applied for. He/she has all the rights to terminate the AIA import agent registration if the agent is found to be in violation of any of the terms and conditions of the AIA. This termination may result in the agent being prohibited from importing or exporting animals.

- Applications for importation of dogs that will be staying in South Africa not longer than six months must be done on a form for importation of dogs for certain purposes.

- Applications for importation of dogs that will be staying in South Africa for more than six months or dogs for breeding/hunting purposes must be done on a form for permanent importation.
